## Chairman’s Message: Rising Above the Rhetoric

As I write this message on Memorial Day, 2017, I am reminded of the sacrifices made by the men and women of our armed forces, throughout the history of our great country, to keep us free and to maintain our integrity as a nation. I can’t help but think, as I reflect, of the degradation we are experiencing of late in the manner in which we treat one another and the hateful rhetoric we foist upon one another almost daily. This attitude is certainly not worthy of the men and women we remember and honor this Memorial Day.

A good friend of mine, Ken Mahanes, a minister and educator, spoke these words recently in an invocation he delivered at a recent event: “Whether we are Christian, Jew, Muslim, or non-religious, we agree on Jesus’ seminal teaching that we should treat others as we would want others to treat us. This moral precept transcends ethnicity, race, and religion, and stands in stark contrast to the public incivility, personal insult, and partisan intransigence that characterizes so much of our political discourse, and is unworthy of the sacrifice of those whom we honor on this Memorial Day. May we leave here today rededicated to form a more perfect union deserving of the countless men and women who have given their lives for the country that both they and we love.”

Ken’s words are not aimed at a particular political party, ideology, or philosophy. They are rather aimed at all of us who, for whatever purpose, believe that we must stoop to such low levels to attack those with whom we disagree. Whatever happened to vigorous, but friendly, debate? Whatever happened to the days we could disagree in one forum and then join one another, as friends or acquaintances, over a cup of coffee or a meal?

I believe it is time for all of us to rise above the rhetoric. We are a better people. We are a better nation than to engage in such hostile conduct. One need only keep in mind the Fellowship’s mission, “to promote fellowship, understanding and respect among all religious and cultures,” and, may I add, among all people no matter our beliefs.

Our country deserves our best. Let us give our best. Let us respect one another.

## Excerpts from Frances Fisher's acceptance speech:

Tonight marks an extremely humbling yet exciting moment in my life. It celebrates a bond I am honored to share with each of you – one that champions human dignity, kindness and respect for our fellow man. It's with tremendous gratitude...for the many outstanding leaders who have embraced the mission of the Fellowship that we are offered empowering opportunities to grow gracefully together and lead by example.

I've been fortunate to have those in my life who have shown me the way by example. My loving parents...taught me so many important life lessons and from a very early age I knew that the fulfillment we receive in life is in direct proportion to what we give. Those memories have a lasting place in my heart and have proven to be the foundation for my community involvement.

Another powerful example arose from an early career opportunity that shaped many of my values. I was privileged to serve President George H.W. Bush in the West Wing of the White House. He declared early on that he wanted his presidency to be known as the "Age of the Offered Hand." He believed meaningful results were best achieved through compromise and a respectful difference of opinion.

I developed a profound appreciation for the fact that we as Americans are part of something far larger than ourselves. This country has always been an inspiring example of freedom and democracy, but it also defines moral principle and a high standard of decency and humanity for the rest of the world.

Though I've always been a person of quiet but deep faith, I never imagined I would embark on such an enriching spiritual journey through an interfaith marriage. It has been an enlightening, sometimes challenging, and an extremely rewarding experience. [My husband] Jeff and I recognize that faith is a continuing walk. As we share our beliefs with our son Harrison, we've found a powerful walking stick in prayer.

The life Jeff and I share has given me a unique perspective on the world. The beauty and greatness of our nation comes from the hearts of our people and the dreams of our forefathers being realized in us – the opportunity to live with humility, integrity and excellence with our neighbors. Though Jeff and I have very different backgrounds, they speak to a mainstay of American consciousness. The fabric of our country since its inception has been woven from a myriad of national, ethnic and religious identities. In fact, we are a melting pot of all nations descended from immigrants...my ancestors arrived shortly after the pilgrims crossed on the Mayflower. Jeff's grandparents arrived at an equally powerful time in our history. One foot was firmly planted in a generation that persevered and sought refuge, even sacrificing their given name, while the other was spent raising children and building a business in a generation that dared to dream –The American Dream.

Palm Beach has been the backdrop to adventure for my soul. As a volunteer I've had the opportunity to become involved with individuals from every walk of life and share these experiences with my family. Jeff and I often reflect on how fortunate we are to raise our son in this community, and we've taught Harrison that we are not defined by the sum of our possessions or the size of our bank account but by our character. We talk a lot about the small gestures that often times bring the grandest results. And, by example, we hope to show Harrison what it means to be a loving parent, a loyal friend or a willing volunteer who leaves his community a better place than he found it.

I feel extremely privileged to share this special honor with so many of you who freely and generously open your hearts to others. May the Fellowship of Christians & Jews continue to be an inspiration and shining example for those to come.




