



Palm Beach County Educators Receive Scholarships from the Fellowship for Holocaust Education Training

The eight Palm Beach County teachers above, representing seven public and private schools, attended the Facing History and Ourselves (FHAO) "Holocaust and Human Behavior" seminar in Memphis, Tennessee this past July on full scholarships provided by the Fellowship. Two alums of the program, Chrissie Ferguson and Chuck Hagy, attended the new "Beyond Borders" seminar in Boston in July to build upon the training they had previously received.

"The purpose is to teach the teachers how to educate middle and high school students about Anti-Semitism, the Holocaust, genocide, racism, and bullying. In a word – hate; hatred of others," Fellowship Vice-Chair Maggie Zeidman told the crowd at the Welcome Back Reception in November. "We put our money, and yours, where it counts; where it will make a difference in how our children regard other people."

In an effort to maintain the connection with local teachers who have participated in FHAO seminars, the Fellowship held an inaugural Implementation Workshop in late October to offer ongoing support and inspiration as the teachers use the curriculum in their classrooms. The half-day program, coordinated by Education Committee co-Chair Chuck Hagy with assistance from Chrissie Ferguson and Anne Franzen, was held at The Chesterfield in Palm Beach. Based upon its success, future workshops will be scheduled, and a listserv was created to allow the teachers to continue to share their experiences with each other throughout the year.

Holocaust education was mandated 25 years ago by the Florida legislature but is unfunded. To help provide this vital training, the Fellowship has been sending 5-10 educators to Facing History summer seminars annually, but with a goal of expanding that reach, plans are in the works to host the Holocaust education seminar here locally next July to train up to 40 teachers at once.

Record Number of Participants Give Back to the Community on the Morning after Thanksgiving in 9th Annual Event

More than 125 Fellowship members and friends came together the morning after Thanksgiving to volunteer for Fellowship Friday. Each received a t-shirt and refillable water bottle as they were greeted by Rabbi Michael Resnick, spiritual leader of Temple Emanu-El Palm Beach and founder of the event nine years ago. After a light breakfast hosted by Temple Emanu-El, participants headed out to their choice of five volunteer venues to tackle the varied projects.

Fellowship Friday Chair Eric Christu thanked the volunteers for coming and acknowledged the four Junior Committee members: Aiden Conde, Parker Pressly, Caroline Christu, and Olivia Buhler-Lieberman, before thanking Temple Emanu-El and introducing Rabbi Resnick.

“It is a profound thing that we’re doing in a world that is becoming more and more polarized,” Rabbi Resnick told the group. “This is a remarkable collection of people who are Christians and Jews, of different denominations...people of different political affiliations. We come together for a common purpose and we come together in fellowship in spite of the many differences in our lives. We’re reminded what it is that unifies us – human beings who care about others.”

Fellowship Chair John C. Randolph said the fellowship is celebrating its 27th year, adding, “We count this fellowship as one of our blessings. I’m very thankful for everything all of you have done for the fellowship.”

Volunteer sites included Big Dog Ranch Rescue, Adopt-A-Family Program Reach, the Levine Jewish Residential & Family Service, a beach cleanup along South Ocean Boulevard, and, new this season, The Lord’s Place’s Halle Place campus, where volunteers worked on gardening projects at this supportive housing facility for women.

“The Lord’s Place is so grateful that members of the Palm Beach Fellowship of Christians & Jews helped make Halle Place more beautiful by planting dozens of flowering plants at the front of the campus and in the back butterfly garden, and adding colorful flower pots at all the doorways,” said David Rogers, The Lord’s Place Volunteer Coordinator. The facility hosts a dozen residents.

For the fourth year, artist Sandra Thompson coordinated an art project with Fellowship Friday volunteers at the Levine location, a loving home for developmentally challenged adults.



Volunteers painted an apartment and worked in the food pantry at Program Reach, a shelter for homeless families with children in West Palm Beach, while others worked with the dogs at Big Dog Ranch Rescue in Loxahatchee. The beach cleanup, coordinated by Diane Buhler and the Friends of Palm Beach, netted more than 80 pounds of trash collected by 32 volunteers.

Toys that were collected before and during the event were donated to the Town of Palm Beach Toy Drive and nonperishable food items were donated to Adopt-a-Family.
